TAKE NOTICE THAT, the Council of The Corporation of Norfolk County intends to designate the McCall/Kinney Residence located on Part Lot 10, Block 2, Plan 32B, municipally known as 176 Townline Street, St. Williams, ON, within Norfolk County, as being of cultural heritage value or interest.

The McCall/Kinney house (circa 1867) represents a classic example of the brick Ontario farmhouse built at the time of confederation and is a classic example of the red-brick Gothic Revival farmhouses so commonly found in Ontario with its steeply pitched front roof peak, pointed arched window and bargeboard trim work. While this lovely old house has changed hands a number of times over the years including a stint as a nursing home, thanks to the stewardship of its previous owners, the fine woodworking and other craftsmanship of the period has survived the passage of time.
