Take notice that the Council of the City of Toronto on March 26 and 27, 2018, having considered an application to demolish a structure designated under Part IV of the Ontario Heritage Act for 170 Merton Street, decided among other things, to:

1. Refuse the issuance of a demolition permit for the heritage property at 170 Merton Street, in accordance with Section 34 of the Ontario Heritage Act.

Appeal to the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal

The Ontario Heritage Act states that if a Council of a municipality consents to an application to demolish a designated property subject to certain terms or conditions or refuses the application, the owner may, within thirty days of the day the owner received notice of Council's decision, give notice of appeal to the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal and to the Clerk of the municipality: Attention Ellen Devlin, Administrator, Toronto and East York Community Council, Toronto City Hall, 2nd Floor West, 100 Queen Street West, Toronto, Ontario, M5H 2N2. Notice of appeal must be received on or before May 7, 2018.

A notice of appeal shall set out the reasons for objection to the decision of Council and be accompanied by the fee prescribed (\$300.00) under the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal.
