This notice is being served in accordance with Section 29 of the Act.



**Description of Property** - Gregg Cemetery, Lot 2 Concession 13,  
Lakeridge Road, Scugog Ontario

The Gregg Family Cemetery is small rural family burial ground located on east side of Lakeridge Road ,north of the Blue Mountain Road, and south of the community of Victoria Corners.

The Cemetery consist of approximately 32 grave markers made from marble and coloured granite commemorating the Gregg family who were early settlers of Reach and Uxbridge Township.

**Statement of Cultural Heritage Value or Interest**

The Gregg Family Cemetery has cultural heritage value as small rural Ontario family burial place that provides a window into the lives of one particular 19<sup>th</sup> century family who settled in near the border of Reach and Uxbridge Township.

The Gregg family cemetery is characterized by a neatly kept lawn bordered by trees and a simple cedar post and steel wire fence having panoramic views of the surrounding rolling hills of Scugog and Uxbridge Township.

**Description of Heritage Attributes**

Key attributes of the Gregg Family Cemetery that reflect its value as a link to the early history of Reach and Uxbridge Township and as an example of a small 19<sup>th</sup> century rural village cemetery are:

- Its manicured lawn;
- Its shade trees and shrubs along its boundary;
- Its simple cedar post and steel wire farm fence;
- The variety of styles, materials and symbolism represented in the markers and monuments;
- The range of size and sophistication of markers from modest to elaborate;
- Its location, orientation and dimensions;
- Its panoramic views of the surrounding country side;
