BEING A BY-LAW TO DESIGNATE AD JUNE, ACIS 275 NORTH STREET, PORT PERRY AS BEING OF HERITAGE VALUE OR INTEREST

WHEREAS pursuant to Part IV of the *Ontario Heritage Act*, the Council of a municipality is authorized to enact by-laws to designate a real property, including all the buildings and structures thereon, to be of cultural heritage value or interest;

AND WHEREAS the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Scugog has caused to be served on the owners of the lands and premises at 275 North Street, Port Perry, and upon the Ontario Heritage Trust, notice of intention to designate 275 North Street;

AND WHEREAS Council's intention to so designate has been duly advertised with no objections thereto;

AND WHEREAS the reasons for the designation are set out in Schedule "B" attached hereto and forming part of this By-Law;

NOW THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF SCUGOG enacts as follows:

 THAT the following real property, more particularly described in Schedule "A" attached hereto and forming part of this By-Law is hereby designated as being of cultural heritage value or interest:

Description of Property-275 North Street, Port Perry, Ontario

The property occupied by the residence at 275 North Street is located on the north side of North Street, three properties east of Simcoe Street, in the historic residential neighbourhood immediately north of the historic commercial core of Port Perry.

Statement of Cultural Heritage Value or Interest

The custom Tudor Revival house located at 275 North Street was constructed in 1975 for local realtor George Stone and his wife Ruth. George Stone began to sell real estate in 1964 after farming at Greenbank Ontario. His business prospered and he was able to purchase two historic commercial blocks on Queen Street which housed his office, and are still owned and lovingly maintained by his family today. Tudor Revival homes were popular in the 1920's and enjoyed a second period of popularity in the late 1960's and 1970's for executive and estate homes. The George Stone residence at 275 North Street features hallmark elements of the style including faux half timbering, stucco siding, a cantilevered second storey, faux leaded glass windows, clipped gables and a prominent brick chimney. Like other historic revival homes, their architecture looks back in time for inspiration to convey a sense of stability and cultural awareness, fitting for a successful local businessman and his family.

Description of Heritage Attributes

Key exterior attributes that embody the heritage value of the house located at 275 North Street include its:

- irregular asymmetrical building footprint;
- overall building form and massing;
- steep gabled roof with clipped end gables;
- asphalt shingle roof resembling cedar shingles;
- · faux half timbering and stucco siding;
- dark reddish brown brick walls, integrated planter and chimney with rusticated stone accents;
- cantilevered second storey;
- second storey box bay window;
- front veranda and rustic wooden veranda posts and brackets;
- original window and door openings with faux leaded glass windows;
- wooden garage doors with faux forged iron strap hinges;
- gabled dormers over the garage roof; and
- · faux wrought iron exterior lights.
