THE CORPORATION OF THE VILLAGE OF BRIGHTON

BY-LAW NUMBER 1976-105

Being a by-law to designate a certain property

WHEREAS The Ontario Heritage Act 1974, S.O. Chapter 122 authorizes councils of municipalities to pass by-laws designating certain properties and


WHEREAS the Council of the Corporation of the Village of Brighton published for three consecutive weeks in the Brighton Independent, notice of intention to designate property known as the Proctor House and

WHEREAS no notice of objection to the designation was served on the Clerk within thirty days of the date of the first publication of the notice, being March 16th, 1976, in the Brighton Independent,

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council of the Corporation of the Village of Brighton ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:


1. The lands and building known locally as the Proctor House, being located on the west side of Young Street and being on Part Lot 1, Con. 2 in the Village of Brighton, because of its architectural and historic importance, is hereby designated.

READ a first and second time, read a third time and finally passed this 19th day of April, 1976.
