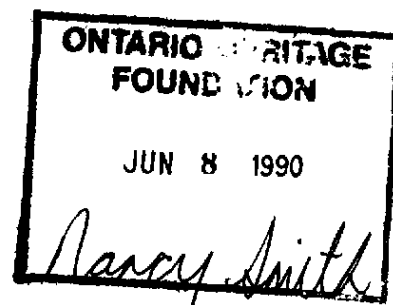

BY-LAW NUMBER...338...90

A By-law to repeal By-law 623-89, being a by-law to designate the "Millworkers' Double House" located at 1595-97 Eglinton Avenue West as being of historical, architectural and contextual importance

WHEREAS the Council of The Corporation of the City of Mississauga enacted By-law No. 623-89 on the 16th day of August, 1989 designating the "Millworkers' Double House" located at 1595-97 Eglinton Avenue West as a property of historical, architectural and contextual importance under Part IV of The Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1980, c.337;

AND WHEREAS the lands and premises being the subject matter of By-law No. 623-89 are more properly described in Schedule 'A' attached hereto;

AND WHEREAS the Local Architectural Conservation Advisory Committee received an application to demolish the aforesaid premises;

AND WHEREAS the time period set out in Section 34 (5) (b) of The Ontario Heritage Act has expired, with no agreement being reached by the property owner and the City of Mississauga;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of The Corporation of the City of Mississauga ENACTS as follows:

1. That By-law No. 623-89 of The Corporation of the City of Mississauga, enacted on the 16th day of August, 1989, is hereby repealed.
2. That the City Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be served upon the owner of the aforesaid property and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation and to cause notice of this by-law to be published in a newspaper having general circulation in the City of Mississauga.
3. That the City Solicitor is hereby directed to register a copy of this by-law against the subject property.
