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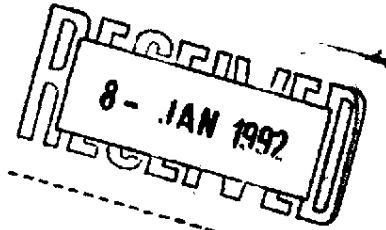

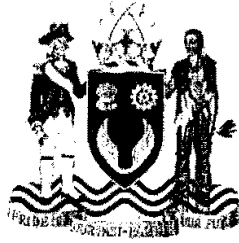

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THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF MISSISSAUGA

BY-LAW NUMBER 640-92

A by-law to repeal part of By-law 461-78, being a by-law to designate the "Adamson House" located on Adamson Lane off Enola Avenue, as being of architectural value and historical interest

WHEREAS the Council of The Corporation of the City of Mississauga enacted By-law 461-78 on August 14, 1978, designating The Adamson Estate or The Adamson-Proteus Estate on Adamson Lane off Enola Avenue as being of architectural value and historical interest;

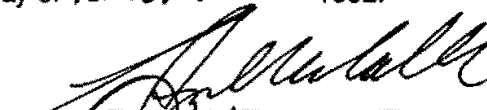

AND WHEREAS it has been determined in light of current research, that the "Peacock House" as stated in Schedule 'A' to By-law 461-78, as "a second house built in 1902" has been found to be of less significance in architectural merit than all the other structures located on The Adamson Estate;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of The Corporation of the City of Mississauga ENACTS as follows:

1. That By-law 461-78 is repealed insofar as it affects the real property described in Schedule 'A' hereto; that real property being the lands upon which the second house, known as the "Peacock House", was built in 1902.
2. That the City Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be served upon the owner of the aforesaid property, and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation, and to cause notice of this by-law to be published in a newspaper having general circulation in the City of Mississauga.
3. That the City Solicitor is hereby directed to register a copy of this by-law against the subject property.
