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

# 7 Austin Terrace (John B. Maclean House) – Application to Demolish a Structure on a Designated Property Under Part IV of the Ontario Heritage Act

Take notice that the Council of the City of Toronto on March 8 and 9, 2011, having considered an application for demolition for the property at 7 Austin Terrace (John B. Maclean House), decided to:

- 1. Refuse the application for demolition under Section 34 of the Ontario Heritage Act for the property at 7 Austin Terrace.
- 2. Authorize the City Solicitor and the necessary City staff to attend at the Ontario Municipal Board hearing in opposition, if the owner appeals Council's decision to refuse the application for demolition under Section 34 of the Ontario Heritage Act.

## Notice of Appeal:

The Ontario Heritage Act states that where Council refuses an application to demolish designated

buildings, the owner of property who wishes to appeal the decision of the Council of a municipality shall, within 30 days of the day the owner received notice of the Council's decision, give notice of appeal to the Ontario Municipal Board and to the Clerk of the municipality. A notice of appeal must be received on or before April 29, 2011.

A notice of appeal shall set out the reasons for objection to the decision of the Council of the municipality and be accompanied by the fee prescribed (\$125.00) under the Ontario Municipal Board Act.
