# BY-LAW NUMBER 156-78

A BY-LAW TO DESIGNATE THE PROPERTY KNOWN MUNICIPALLY AS 5 HENRY STREET AS BEING OF ARCHITECTURAL AND/OR HISTORICAL VALUE OR INTEREST

WHEREAS section 29 of the Ontario Heritage Act, 1974 authorizes the Council of a municipality to enact by-laws to designate real property, including all buildings and structures thereon, to be of architectural or historic value or interest; and

WHEREAS the Council of the Corporation of the City of Brockville has caused to be served on the owners of the lands and premises known as Isaac Beecher House at 5 Henry Street and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation, notice of intention to so designate the aforesaid real property and has caused such notice of intention to be published in the same newspaper having general circulation in the municipality once for each of three consecutive weeks; and

WHEREAS the reasons for designation are:

The house is a fine example of vernacular Loyalist stone construction, common to this area during the early 19th century. The well-preserved structure retains much of its original materials and workmanship. The Beecher family was influential in the early Political and Industrial history or Brockville.

The building is also destined to become Brockville's first permanent Museum; and

WHEREAS no notice of objection to the proposed designation has been served on the clerk of the municipality;

THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF BROCKVILLE ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

- 1) There is designated as being of architectural and/or historical value or interest the real property known as Isaac Beecher House at 5 Henry Street, more particularly described in Schedule A hereto.
- 2) The municipal solicitor is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be registered against the property described in Schedule A hereto in the proper land registry office.
- By-law to be served on the owner of the aforesaid property and on the Ontario Heritage Foundation and to cause notice of the passing of this by-law to be published in the same newspaper having general circulation in the municipality once for each of three consecutive weeks.

### Description of Beecher House Property

ALL AND SINGULAR that certain parcel or tract of land and premises, situate, lying and being in the City of Brockville in the County of Leeds, being composed of part of Lots 50 and 51 in Block 30 according to Chipman's Compiled Plan of the Town of Brockville, filed in the Registry Office for the Registry Division of Leeds (No. 28) as Plan 67, more particularly described as follows:

PREMISING that the bearings herein mentioned are astronomic and refer to the meridian passing through the north western corner of said Lot 50;

COMMENCING at a point in the western limit of said Lot 50, distant south 22 degrees 28 minutes 30 seconds east thereon 79.89 feet from the north western corner of said Lot;

THENCE south 22 degrees 28 minutes 30 seconds east, along the western limit of said Lot 50, a distance of 80.4 feet;

THENCE north 67 degrees 14 minutes east 90.41 feet;

THENCE north 22 degrees 46 minutes west 80.4 feet;
