NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Town of St. Marys intends to designate the property, at the following municipal address as a property of architectural value or interest under Part IV of The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, S. O. Chapter 122.

SCHEDULE A

THE CHURCH STREET BRIDGE: This 80' span, completed on Oct. 13, 1884, was built of St. Marys limestone, by local stonemasons, Messrs. James Clyde and James Elliott at a cost of \$3,800. The bridge was designed by Mr. W. Williams who was also the architect of the old Park Street Bridge (now replaced).

This graceful 2 arched structure, which blends harmoniously into the landscape along Trout Creek, should be designated at this time in order to preserve it, along with the Victoria Bridge, as the only surviving examples of stone bridges in the Town.

Any person may, within thirty days of the first publication of this notice, send by registered mail or deliver to the Clerk of the Town of St. Marys notice of his or her objection to the proposed designation together with a statement of the reasons for the objection and all relevant facts. If such a Notice of Objection is received, the Council of the Corporation of the Town of St. Marys shall refer the matter to the Conservation Review Board for a hearing.
