## NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Town of St. Marys intends to designate the property, including lands and buildings, at the following municipal address as a property of architectural value or interest under Part IV of The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, S. O. Chapter 122.

- (a) Municipal Address — Lot 1, Plan 225,  
Queen St. E.

### Reasons for the Proposed Designation

The Water Tower was built in 1899 and is a solid stone structure which is representative of other stone buildings erected during this period in the Town of St. Marys. It is one of the best examples of industrial architecture constructed during the turn of the century in Southwestern Ontario and still in use.

Any person may, within thirty days of the first publication of this notice, send by registered mail or deliver to the Clerk of the Town of St. Marys, notice of his or her objection to the proposed designation together with a statement of the reasons for the objection and all relevant facts. If such a Notice of Objection is received, the Council of the Corporation of the Town of St. Marys shall refer the matter to the Conservation Review Board for a hearing.
