Notice of Intention to Designate

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the
Town of St. Marys Intends to designate the property, in-
cluding lands and buildings, at the following municipal ad-
dress as a property of architectural value or interest under
Part IV of the Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, S.O. Chapter 122.

Municipal Address: 115 Queen Street East

Reasons For Designation:

Mary's Men's and Ladies' Shop is one of the best preserved
limestone blocks in St. Marys. Built certainly before 1859, it
is also one of the earliest in date. In addition, this building
may be on the site of one of two log stores erected by
Lauristan Cruttenden and James McKay in 1843.

The lower part of the coursed rubble stone facade is well-
preserved; the cast iron supports still exist, as does the
horizontal window band which is beneath the large front
sign. Although the original wooden window framing had to
be replaced, the simple, frame design which was added is
very effectively in keeping with the store front as a whole.
In all, this fine limestone structure is found to be most
deserving of designation.

Notice of objection to the proposed designation, together
with a statement of the reasons for the objection and all
relevant facts may be served on the Clerk of the Town of
St. Marys before the 30th day of September, 1981.
