**RECEIVED****THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF PETROLIA****BY-LAW NUMBER 09 - 2004**

A BY-LAW TO DESIGNATE THE PROPERTY KNOWN AS THE  
CENOTAPH LOCATED IN VICTORIA PARK, IN THE TOWN OF PETROLIA,  
AS BEING ARCHITECTURAL OR HISTORICAL VALUE OR INTEREST.


WHEREAS Section 52 of the Ontario Heritage Act, 1910, R.S.O.  
Chapter 6.18, authorizes the Council of a Municipality to enact By-Laws to  
designate real property, including all buildings and structures thereon, to be of  
architectural or historical value or interest, and

WHEREAS the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Petrolia has  
caused to be served on the owner of the lands and premises of the cenotaph  
located in Victoria Park, in the Town of Petrolia, and upon the Ontario  
Heritage Foundation, notice of intention to be published in the same  
newspaper having general circulation in the municipality for three weeks; and

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the Town of  
Petrolia Hereby Enacts As Follows:

1. This is designated as being of architectural and historical value or  
interest of the real property as the cenotaph located in Victoria Park, in the  
Town of Petrolia, Province of Ontario, more particularly described in "A"  
hereto.
2. The Municipal Solicitor is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this By-  
Law to be registered against the property described in Schedule "B" hereto in  
the proper land registry office.
3. The Clerk Administrator is hereby authorized to cause a copy of the  
By-Law to be served on the owner of the aforesaid property and on the  
Ontario Heritage Foundation and to cause notice of the passing of this By-  
Law to be published in the same newspaper having general circulation in the  
municipality.

By-Law read a First, Second and Third time and finally passed this 8<sup>th</sup>,  
day of March, 2004.

#### **Architectural Reasons:**

The solemn granite soldier was designed by Toronto sculptor Emmanuel  
Hahn. It is rich with symbolic details, such as the cross the figure holds, the  
flag draped behind him and the poppies and chain at his feet. The names of  
88 men are inscribed on the monument.
