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Document General Form 4 — Land Registration Reform Act, 1984

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BY-LAW NUMBER 189-88 OF THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF STRATFORD

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BEING a by-law to designate the real property known municipally as 90 Front Street as being of architectural and historical value or interest.

WHEREAS Section 29 of The Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1980, Chapter 337, authorizes the Council of a municipality to enact by-laws to designate real property including all buildings and structures thereon, to be of architectural and historical value or interest;

AND WHEREAS the Municipal Council of The Corporation of the City of Stratford has consulted with its Local Architectural Conservation Advisory Committee;

AND WHEREAS the Council of The Corporation of the City of Stratford has caused to be served upon The Ontario Heritage Foundation and the owners of the property known as 90 Front Street notice of its intention to so designate the aforesaid real property and has caused general circulation in the City of Stratford by publication of the notice of intention in a newspaper having general circulation in the municipality once for each of three consecutive weeks;

AND WHEREAS no notice of objection to the proposed designation has been served on the Clerk of the Municipality;

THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the City of Stratford ENACTS as follows:

- 1. There is designated as being of architectural and historical value or interest the real property known as 90 Front Street in the City of Stratford for the reasons described in Schedule "A" attached hereto.
- 2. The Municipal Solicitor is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be registered against the property described in Schedule "A" hereto in the proper land registry office which property is legally described in Schedule "B" attached hereto.
- 3. The Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be served on The Ontario Heritage Foundation and the owner of the property and to cause notice of the passing of this by-law to be published in the Stratford Beacon Herald being a paper having general circulation in the municipality once for each of three consecutive weeks.

SCHEDULE 'A'

Reasons for the Proposed Designation:

The house at 90 Front Street was built during the summer of 1897 by Colomba Mannering, a widow, who also owned neighbouring 157 Water Street

May Patterson purchased 90 Front Street from the Mannering estate in 1905. The property was passed to Martha Patterson when she purchased it in 1911. The Patterson sisters operated a millinery in Stratford at 40 Downie Street.

In 1927, Helen M. Dunsmore, window of James Dunsmore, was granted the property. Helen M. Dunsmore married Herbert Denroche, city tax collector. He was highly involved with the Perth Regiment, having been appointed Lieutenant-Colonel on Dec. 31, 1932. Herbert Denroche died of carbon monoxide poisoning in an accident which occured at 90 Front Street while repairing his car in the garage. His widow continued to live at 90 Front Street until 1937 when she sold the property to Christena Stewart and Oral McMillan. Christena Stewart and Oral McMillan owned 90 Front Street as joint tenants until Christena Stewart's death in 1954. Oral McMillan, a school teacher in Stratford for many years, continued to own the house until 1985. At that time, the property was sold to
