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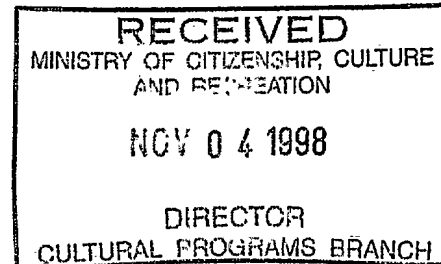

**Notice of Intention to Designate**

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Cambridge intends to  
designate the exterior of the following property of the architectural significance under  
Part IV of the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990, Ch.0.18.

**10 Byng Avenue**

10 Byng Avenue is recommended for designation based on its architectural significance.  
Described by local architect Ross Anderson as "a well preserved example of the cottage  
style stuccoed frame dwelling from the early 20th century", it occupies a site above  
Queen's Square amongst other historic residences.

ANY PERSON MAY, within thirty days of this publication of this notice, send by  
registered mail or deliver to the Clerk of the City of Cambridge, notice of his objection to  
the proposed designation together with a statement of the reasons for the objection and all  
relevant facts. If such a notice is received the Council of the Corporation of the City of  
Cambridge shall refer the matter to the Conservation Review Board for a hearing.
