NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE- 496 WALKER'S LINE

IN THE MATTER OF THE *ONTARIO HERITAGE ACT* AND IN THE MATTER OF the lands in the City of Burlington known municipally as 496 Walker's Line.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the City of Burlington intends to designate the above-noted property under section 29 of the *Ontario Heritage Act*.

Description of Property

496 Walker's Line is located north of the intersection of New Street and Walker's Line in the Dynes neighbourhood. It is occupied by a two-and-a-half storey redbrick house built circa 1913, called "The John Henry Walker Jr. House".

Legal Description: CON 3 SDS PT LOT 11; City of Burlington, Regional Municipality of Halton.



Statement of Cultural Heritage Value or Interest (Contact heritage@burlington.ca for full document):

The John Henry Walker Jr. House is a good, representative example of an Edwardian style house with Queen Anne revival features. The property displays a high degree of craftsmanship, visible in the arched windows on the building. The property has historical value for its connection to the Walker family, who began farming in Nelson Township in 1816, 57 years before the Village of Burlington was founded.
