## Notice of Intention to Designate St. John's Anglican Church



In the matter of the Ontario Heritage Act and in the matter of the lands in the Town of Halton Hills known municipally as 10996 Trafalgar Road, legally described as "PT LT 15, CON 7, AS IN EW4112 & EW4113; HALTON HILLS/ESQUESING", Regional Municipality of Halton, and known as St. John's Anglican Church.



## Statement of Cultural Heritage Value or Interest:

The property has been identified as having cultural heritage value as an early representative of a rural church building with Gothic Revival influences, closely associated with early Protestant church communities in Halton Hills including the Methodist and Anglican churches, associations with the Stewarttown community, and contextual value as a landmark at the southern terminus of Stewarttown.
