## MONOF MONO IN Interview Manktelow Farm Heritage Designation

Council accepted the recommendation of the Heritage Advisory Committee to designate the Manktelow Farm as a heritage property.

Council for the Corporation of the Town of Mono hereby gives notice to designate 953219 7th Line EHS, Mono, ON (WEST PT LOT 6, CON 8 EHS) Also known as the "Manktelow Farm" Under Part IV of the Ontario Heritage Act

The property was just one of the many properties owned by the Cobean family, a well-known pioneering family in the eastern part of Mono. The main house, comprised of an older one-and-a-half storey cottage and a later one-and-a-half storey addition, is a good surviving example of the popular "Ontario vernacular cottage", the addition being a subset of the gothic revival style. The log outbuilding was likely built between 1830-1836 and is in excellent condition, a rare state for an original log building of this vintage in Mono. The main cottage was likely built before 1854, and the addition likely built between 1874-1885. The balanced symmetry of the addition, the full-width front porch, the gingerbread and decoration, the central door and the arched gable window in the centre peak are representative of the gothic revival style, popular in Ontario in the mid to late 1800's. Together with the log structure, the cottage and addition make up an attractive juxtaposition of buildings – the style, materials and purpose of each building representing a different timeframe in Mono's history.
