**Property Description:** 

The Municipal Building was feted in the Porcupine Advance as "one of the most modern municipal centers in Northern Ontario" on its official opening in 1938. A recent addition is the mural by artist Mique Michelle, completed in 2019, as

part of the Indigenous Teachings Murals Project.

## Statement of Cultural Heritage Value and/or Interest:

Property at 220 Algonquin Boulevard East meets the following criteria for designation under O.Reg 9/06:

- The property has <u>design value or physical value</u> because It is a rare, unique, representative or early example of a style, type, expression, material or construction method
- The property has <u>historical value or associative value</u> because it has direct
  associations with a theme, event, belief, person, activity, organization or
  institution that is significant to a community; it yields, or has the potential to yield,
  information that contributes to an understanding of a community or culture; and it
  demonstrates or reflects the work or ideas of an architect, artist, building,
  designer or theorist who is significant to a community.

 The property has contextual value because it is important in defining, maintaining or support the character of an area; it is physically, functionally, visually or historically linked to its surroundings; and it is a landmark.

## **Description of Heritage Attributes:**

- Face-brick detailing on face of the building.
- · Symmetrical arrangement and proportion of window openings.
- · Original stonework at roofline and around the entrance to the building.
- The central entrance and staircase (as feature of the interior and exterior arrangement).
- Terrazzo flooring to second floor and on the central staircase.
- · Plagues mounted to outside of building.
