Re: Kingston City Council Meeting, August 9, 2022 – Clause 1iv of Report Number 76: Received from Heritage Kingston with respect to Application for Ontario Heritage Act Approval – 221 Queen Street

At the regular meeting on August 9, 2022, Council approved Clause 1iv of Report Number 76: Received from Heritage Kingston with respect to Application for Ontario Heritage Act Approval – 221 Queen Street:

That alterations to the property at 221 Queen Street, be approved in accordance with details described in the application (P18-067-2022), which was deemed completed on June 2, 2022 with said alterations to include:

1. Install one mast arm sign along Queen Street with back-lit acrylic letters on a black anodized aluminum face, approximately 1 metre wide and 1 metre tall and 2.7 metres above grade;
2. Install one wall sign facing Colborne Street with back-lit acrylic letters on a black anodized aluminum face, approximately 0.75 metres wide and 0.75 metres tall and 1.7metres above grade; and

That the approval of the alterations be subject to the following conditions:

1. All masonry works shall be completed in accordance with the City's Policy on Masonry Restoration in Heritage Buildings;
2. An Encroachment Permit shall be obtained, as necessary;

3. A Temporary Access Permit shall be obtained, as necessary;
4. A Building Permit shall be obtained, as necessary;
5. Heritage Planning staff shall be circulated the drawings and design specifications tied to the Building Permit application for review and approval to ensure consistency with the scope of the Heritage Permit sought by this application; and
6. Any minor deviations from the submitted plans, which meet the intent of this approval and does not further impact the heritage attributes of the property, shall be delegated to the Director of Heritage Services for review and approval.
