### DESIGNATION OF PROPERTY OF HISTORICAL VALUE

#### TAKE NOTICE THAT:

The Council for the Township of Douro intends to pass a by-law at the regular meeting held September 16th, 1986, to designate the following property in the Township of Douro to be of historical value or interest pursuant to the provisions of the Ontario Heritage Act, 1980.

#### PROPOSED PROPERTY:

A portion of St. Joseph's Cemetery located in the hamlet of Douro and described as follows:  
The Westerly 165' of the Northerly 264' of Lot 5 Concession 4 for the said Township of Douro.

#### REASONS FOR

#### PROPOSED DESIGNATION:

To publicly recognize that many of the original Peter Robinson settlers who arrived in Douro during the early 1800s are buried in the proposed area for designation.

The tombstone inscriptions have provided and will continue to provide, historical reference to individuals researching ancestral history.

Any objection to the proposed designation of the property may be served upon the undersigned, setting out the reasons for such objection, by September 16th, either in writing or attendance at the Council meeting held in the Municipal office at 7:30 p.m.
