TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Village of
Port Stanley intends to designate the property, including lands
and buildings, at the following municipal address 215 Main St.,
Port Stanley, as a property of architectural ~~and~~
~~historical~~ value or interest under Part IV of The Ontario Heritage
Act, R.S.O. 1980, Chapter 337.

REASONS FOR THE PROPOSED DESIGNATION

The west facade of 215 Main Street is recommended for designation for
architectural reasons.

215 is one of the earliest remaining structures on Main Street and
was constructed in 1853, serving many functions over the years. The
west facade, which contains the original storefront, has been unaltered,
and is worthy of designation as it stands now in its original form.
The storefront consists of four tall slender windows, arched at the
top, with circular wood detailing separating them.

There are also a pair of narrow, double, solid pine doors serving
as an entrance to the shop. Immediately in front of the windows
is a trap door entrance to the basement beneath.

This building is an excellent example of many frame structures built
in Ontario in the 1850's to house a business on the ground floor with
living quarters above.

Notice of objection to the proposed designation, together with a
statement of the reasons for the objection and all relevant facts
may be served on the Clerk of the Village of Port Stanley before
the 24 day of May, 1983.
