NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

Take notice that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Toronto, on the 10th day of October, 1978, decided to designate the lands and buildings, known municipally as Nos.89-91 Gloucester Street, as a property of architectural value or interest under The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, 1974 S.O. Chapter 122.

Short Statement of the Reasons for the Proposed Designation:

Nos.89-91 Gloucester Street (Semi-detached house). This building is recommended for designation for architectural reasons. In 1871 this semi-detached house was the first to be built on this side of Gloucester, East of Church Street. A steeply pitched gable with a central arched-shuttered opening and decorated wood bargeboards surmounts a central projection dividing the building facade. The symmetrical window pattern and gently arched brick lintels are features of note in a design which set the pattern for later adjacent architecture. This building is an important element in the context of this part of Gloucester Street.

Notice of objection to the designation may be served on the Clerk within thirty days of the 27th day of October, 1978. (File 1598).
