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

Please be advised that City Council at its regular meeting of October 6th, 2003, resolved its intention to designate the above-noted lands under the Ontario Heritage Act.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

TAKE NOTICE THAT the Council of the Corporation of the City of St. Catharines intends to designate property to be of historical or architectural value under the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter 0.18, as follows:

29 EDMUND STREET

Located on the north side of Edmund Street, between George Street and Catherine Street in the former County of Lincoln, now in the City of St. Catharines, in the Regional Municipality of Niagara. The legal description of the property is Part of Lot B, Thompson Plan CY 68, designated as Parts 2 and 3 on Reference Plan 30R-4118.

The following is a short statement of the reason for the proposed designation:

Heritage House (a.k.a. Thompson House) was built around 1870 by Theodore Thompson. The house, which is used as a Bed and Breakfast, is a blend of mid-nineteenth century vernacular styles, notably Italianate and Gothic Revival.

More detailed Reasons for Designation can be obtained from the Planning Services Department.

Notice of Objection to the designation may be served on the Clerk of the City of St. Catharines within thirty (30) days after the date of publication of this Notice of Intention in a newspaper having general circulation in the Municipality.
