Nos. 5, 7 and 9 Sultan Street. These buildings are recommended for designation for architectural reasons. Built in 1888 by Charles R. Rundle, contractor, these two and one half storey brick semi-detached houses are well executed examples of late Victorian residential design. The Romanesque style of brick-arched recessed entrances that is repeated in the arched brick drip moulding over the ground floor windows and the Terra-cotta band courses and brick pilasters that flank the gable and hipped wall dormers are distinctive features.
