Take notice that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Toronto, on the 1st day of October, 1975, decided to designate the lands and buildings, known municipally as 41-43 Front Street East, as a property of historical and architectural value or interest under The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, S.O. Chapter 122.


Short Statement of the Reasons for the Proposed Designation:

The F. & G. Perkins Building (now Continental Salvage), 41-43 Front Street East; 1873-74 by Darling & MacDougall.

The F. & G. Perkins Building is listed for its outstanding architectural significance as a utilitarian warehouse/showroom building given a strong architectural character, partially as an advertisement for the merchants housed there and partially as an indication of their wealth and prominence. This public character is typical of the buildings on the south side of Front Street East, of which the Perkins Building forms an integral and extremely important part. The building is also historically important as possibly the largest known work in which Frank Darling, one of Canada's most important architects, was involved.

Notice of objection to the designation may be served on the Clerk within thirty days of October 10th, 1975.
