

Chapter 122.

Short Statement of the Reasons for the Proposed Designation:

The Runnymede Development Corporation Building (originally Consumers' Gas Company) is recommended for designation for architectural reasons. Built in 1899 as a Purifying House for Consumers' Gas Company it is a very good example of industrial building design expressed through its prominent architectural form and fenestration detail. It is important also in context with other similar structures erected by the same company in the area.
