Take notice that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Toronto, on the 17th and 19th days of September, 1975, decided to designate the lands and buildings, known municipally as 49-51 Wellington Street East, as a property of architectural value or interest under The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, S.O. Chapter 122. The reason for the proposed designation is that the property is a notable example of a building by an important Toronto architect working in a combination of the modern Gothic Revival and Romanesque Revival styles. The building is perhaps most important in streetscape terms for the landmark quality of the corner tower set at the apex of the gore site. The tower was specifically planned as an architectural feature but functioned even more as a symbol of the wealth and position of the Gooderham family in the Toronto economy.

Notice of objection to the designation may be served on the Clerk within thirty days of September 26th 1975.
