Take notice that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Toronto, on the 7th day of May, 1981, decided to designate the lands and buildings known municipally as No.75 Simcoe Street, as a property of architectural and historical value or interest, under The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, 1974 S.O. Chapter 122.

Short Statement of Reasons for the Proposed Designation

No 75 Simcoe Street (St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church) is recommended for designation for architectural and historical reasons. Built in 1875 to replace the original building at Church and Adelaide Streets, this church is an outstanding example of the work of Architect William George Storm. The picturesque, massive and richly detailed stone exterior with towers, spires and bartizans, is complemented by the interior serenity of the decorative chancel, the stained glass and the sweeping balcony in the nave. The congregation, founded in 1830 in connection with the Church of Scotland, has historic links with the development of social work in the city of Toronto.

Notice of Objection to the designation may be served on the Clerk within thirty days of the 26th of May, 1981. (File 2101)
