Notice is hereby given that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Woodstock intends to designate as property of historic or architectural value or interest the following property for the following reasons.

Property

Old Registry Office
Hunter Street

Reasons for Designation

The first registry office built in Oxford County was located west of this building at the corner of Hunter and Light Streets, Woodstock, 1847. This building the second registry office was constructed in 1876 and remained in use until 1952. The roof is said to be sand-filled, making the building bomb-proof.

Any person who objects to the proposed designation shall within thirty days after the date of the first publication of this notice serve on the City Clerk or Deputy City Clerk, a notice of objection in writing, setting out the objection and all relevant facts.
