TAKE NOTICE that the Council of The Corporation of the City of Woodstock intends to designate the property, including lands and buildings, at the following municipal address as a property of architectural and/or historical value or interest under Part IV of The Ontario Heritage Act, 1990, R.S.O., Chapter 0.18.

REASONS FOR DESIGNATION

a) Architectural:

- Gothic Revival Style
- exterior walls are made of square uncoursed Limestone ashlar
- a red Sandstone is used for trim including:
  - steeply sloped sills with full lugs
  - Gothic arches over window tops
  - labels over windows ending in carved corbel responds (rosettes)
  - windows are arched in the Gothic style with stained glass panels
  - there are three (3) Rose windows complete with stained glass and full Sandstone belt course surrounding them
  - small buttresses are present
  - the North-west corner has a bell tower on the roof
  - the South-west corner roof has a bell-cast roof
  - the roof is slate



1885 FORMATION OF THE CONGREGATIONAL CHURCH

In 1885 about 100 people from various local churches joined together under the leadership of Rev. William Cuthbertson M.A., founding pastor, to form the first congregational church in Woodstock. The organizational meeting of this fledgling church was held in the Town Council Chamber. The first public services were conducted in the Court House in 1885.
