No. 85-83. A BY-LAW

To repeal By-law No. 172-78 respecting the designation of the Property at No. 76 Dundas Street East

(Passed January 24, 1983.)

The Council of The Corporation of the City of Toronto enacts as follows:

- 1. By-law No. 172-78 being "A By-law To designate the Property at No. 76 Dundas Street East, of architectural value and of historic interest." is hereby repealed.
- 2. The City Solicitor is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be registered against the property described in Schedule "A" hereto in the proper land registry office.
- 3. The City Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be served upon the owner of the aforesaid property and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation and to cause notice of this by-law to be published in a newspaper having general circulation in the City of Toronto and to cause the reference to the property to be deleted from the Register referred to in subsection 27(1) of the Ontario Heritage Act.
