
Take notice that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Toronto, on the 20th, 22nd and 23rd days of June, 1977, decided to designate the lands and buildings, known municipally as No.82 South Drive, as a property of architectural value or interest under The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, 1974 S.O. Chapter 122.

Short Statement of the Reasons for the Proposed Designation:

The house at No.82 South Drive is recommended for designation for architectural reasons. Built about 1886, it is one of the first two-family houses in Rosedale and, as such, it is a good example of a design expression that acknowledges the contextual characteristics of the area in form, scale, detail and material.

Notice of objection to the designation may be served on the Clerk within thirty days of the 8th day of July, 1977. (File 1347).
