Take notice that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Toronto, on the 14th, 15th, and 16th day of October, 1980, decided to designate the lands and buildings, known municipally as No. 223 Sherbourne Street, as a property of architectural value or interest under The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, 1974 S.O. Chapter 122.

Short Statement of Reasons for the Proposed Designation

223 Sherbourne Street (All Saints' Church) is recommended for designation for architectural reasons. All Saints' Anglican Church was designed by R.C. Windeyer, Architect, and it was built in 1874. The style is Pointed Gothic in the Early English tradition. The plan is distinctive for having a tower at the east end which has an octagonal corner turret with pointed roof. Masonry construction is white brick with decorative red brick patterns in the band courses, gabled entrance porches and window arches. The exuberant effect of this polychromatic brickwork makes the church a landmark in the district.

Notice of objection to the designation may be served on the Clerk within thirty days of the 18th of November, 1980. (File 2010)
