Take notice that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Toronto, on the 15th day of October, 1975, decided to designate the lands and buildings, known municipally as 58 Queens Park Drive, at 157 Bloor Street West, as a property of historical value or interest under The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, S.O. Chapter 122.

Short Statement of the Reasons for the Proposed Designation:

The Lillian Massey Building (Food Sciences, The University of Toronto) 58 Queens Park Drive at 157 Bloor Street West (SE) 1908-12 by G. M. Miller, The Lillian Massey Building is recommended for designation for its historical association with the munificent patronage of the University of Toronto by the Massey Family. It is also of interest as a major work of neo-classicism by a significant Toronto architect. Most importantly, the building dominates and defines the southeast corner of Bloor Street West and Queens Park Drive/Avenue Road, marking with the Royal Ontario Museum the northern gateway to the Queens Park - University Campus area.

Notice of objection to the designation may be served on the Clerk within thirty days of January 16th, 1976. (Reference File 0805).
