NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

Take notice that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Toronto, on the 23rd day of July, 1979, decided to designate the lands and buildings, known municipally as No. 86 Lombard Street, as a property of architectural value or interest under The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, 1974 S.O. Chapter 122.

Short Statement of the Reasons for the Proposed Designation:

No. 86 Lombard Street (City Morgue) is recommended for designation for architectural reasons. The third building designed as a City Morgue, it was the work of Robert McCallum in 1907-08 in the City Architect's office. The classical details in stone at the entrance, in the rusticated lower window trim, in the upper band course and pilaster capitals are especially fine in contrast with the red pressed brickwork. An important landmark in Toronto, it was closed as a morgue in 1975 but will continue in new use as a women's cultural centre.

Notice of objection to the designation may be served on the Clerk within thirty days of the 7th day of August, 1979. (File 1819).
