NOTICE OF INTENTION  
TO DESIGNATE

TO: CITIZENS OF SEAFORTH  
JOHN CARDNO

Take notice that the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Seaforth, on the 15th day of October, 1980, decided to designate the lands and buildings known municipally as The Cardno Block, 39-47 Main Street, as property of architectural and historical value or interest under The Ontario Historical Act, 1974, S. O. Chapter 122.

SHORT STATEMENT OF THE REASONS FOR  
THE PROPOSED DESIGNATION

CARDNO BLOCK - The two storey buff brick building, built in 1877 has a distinctive mansard roof with a clock tower, which stands 68 feet high, making it a major landmark. The exterior cladding of the mansard roof and clock tower is slate tile. The second floor facade has seven Romanesque / Italianate styled windows. There are five small round windows on the Mansard roof including the one on the clock tower.

Notice of objection to the designation may be served on the Clerk within thirty days of the 23rd day of October, 1980.
