Chapter 122.

Short Statement of the Reasons for the Proposed Designation:

Graydon Hall, 185 Graydon Hall Drive, is recommended for designation for architectural and historical reasons. It is an exceptionally fine Georgian style stone country house, with elaborate terraces and gardens which determined the design and orientation of the house. Magnificent interior elements include the pine library panelling, main stair hall, Versailles parquet floor, and upstairs cabinetry. It was built in 1935-8 by financier Rupert Bain, whose expertise contributed to the ascendancy of Toronto as a financial centre.

Notice of objection to the designation may be served on the City Clerk within thirty days of October 16, 1981.
