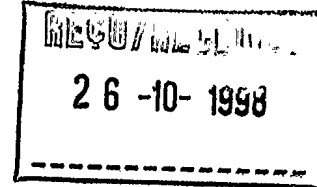

Take notice that the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Fergus intends to designate the property, including lands and buildings at the following municipal address as property of architectural and/or historical value or interest under Part IV of the Ontario Heritage Act:

250 Hill Street West, Fergus, Ontario

Reasons for Designation

This house was built in 1937 in the rare architectural style of the Designated District of Brock Avenue. Its construction made use of ashlar limestone masonry during the depths of the Great Depression. The decade between 1929 and 1939 was the period when stone masons were paid ten cents an hour, and this was the only time in the history of North America that this labour-intensive stone-work was economic. Apart from Brock Avenue, there is only one other house in this style in Fergus.

The builder was Rick Bricker, and the only owners of the house, until recently, [REDACTED]

Notice of objection to the proposed designation, together with a statement of the reasons for the objection and all relevant facts may be served on the Clerk of the Town of Fergus before the 19th of November, 1998.
