HERITAGE DESIGNATION

IN THE MATTER OF THE ONTARIO HERITAGE ACT, R.S.O. 1990, CHAPTER O.18 AND IN THE MATTER OF 1164 QUEEN STREET EAST, SAULT STE. MARIE, IN THE PROVINCE OF ONTARIO

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Sault Ste. Marie intends to designate the property at the following municipal address as property of architectural and/or historical value or interest under Part IV of The Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990, chapter O.18.

REASON FOR PROPOSED DESIGNATION - 1164 QUEEN STREET EAST

It is recommended that the property at 1164 Queen Street East be designated as having heritage significance under the Ontario Heritage Act Part IV. Constructed in 1916, this is one of only two Prairie—style homes in the city. With its original wood windows and large front porch supported by six stuccoed pillars, this prominent property in its east central location is well recognized throughout the community.

NOTICE of objection to the proposed designation together with a statement of reasons for the objection and all relevant facts may be served with the City Clerk of the Corporation of the City of Sault Ste. Marie within 30 days.
