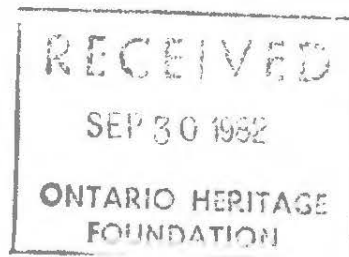



The required ad was placed on September 22nd in our local newspaper, however, I felt that the ad did not adequately describe some of the properties pursuant to The Ontario Heritage Act, Chapter 337, R.S.O. 1980, Part 4. Take notice that the Council of The Corporation of the Town of  
Goderich, on the 20th day of September, 1982 decided to  
designate the lands and buildings, known municipally as "The  
O'Rourke Cottage" as a property of architectural and/or historical  
significance under The Ontario Heritage Act, Chapter 337, R.S.O.  
1980, Part 4.

REASON FOR PROPOSED DESIGNATION

"The O'Rourke Cottage" is recommended for designation for  
historical and architectural reasons. It was built around 1862  
by Thomas Van Every as a labourer's cottage and rented to  
Peter O'Rourke, a teamster who kept two horses on the property.  
O'Rourke bought the house in 1868 and the property remained in  
the family until 1901. The house is built in the Ontario vernacular  
version of the Picturesque style, with a rectangular centre hall  
plan and a central peak. Picturesque elements include the central  
peak, scalloped wooden trim on the main window headings and the  
round-headed window in the peak with its polygonal heading. The  
picket fence surrounding the property helps to frame this delightful  
and authentic labourer's cottage of the mid nineteenth century.

Notice of objection to the designation may be served on the  
Town Clerk within thirty days (30) of the 22nd day of  
September, 1982.
