Take notice that the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Goderich, on the 3rd day of October 1977, decided to designate the lands and buildings, known municipally as Hand's Bakery as a property of architectural and/or historical significance under The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, S.O. Chapter 122.

REASON FOR PROPOSED DESIGNATION

Hand's Bakery is recommended for designation for historical and architectural reasons. Built in the early 1840's by D.B.O. Ford, it was the scene of a costume ball mentioned in In the Days of the Canada Company. Used as a bakery by Henry Hands during the 1850's and 1860's, the house is reputed to have served as a guardhouse during the Fenian raids of 1866. This building is one of the very few examples in Goderich of Greek Revival design, as shown by its plan, with gable end toward the street, pediment with "Palladian" window and dentellae trim, flush boarded front, and bold door surround with fluted Doric columns and heavy entablature.

Notice of objection to the designation may be served on the Town Clerk within thirty days of the 8th day of December 1977.
