Take notice that the Council of the Corporation
of the Borough of North York on the 11th day of
October, 1977 decided to designate the lands and
buildings, known municipally as 1091 Finch Avenue
East as a property of architectural value or
interest under The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974,
S.O. Chapter 122.

Short Statement of the Reasons for the Proposed
Designation:

Zion School, S.S. #12, 1873, built from the
stock plans of Egerton Ryerson. The building is
recommended for designation because it is an
excellent example of a simple, red brick, one-
room, rural Ontario schoolhouse. Each of the
plain facades is highlighted by white brick quoins,
segmental voussoirs and a horizontal string course.
The building is historically significant because it
possesses the distinction of being North York's last
remaining "Little Red Schoolhouse".

Notice of objection to the designation may be
served on the Clerk within thirty days of November
30th, 1977.
