Take notice that the Council of the Corporation of
the City of North York on the 15th day of December,
1980, decided to designate the lands and building
known municipally as the Jacob Stong House, 4700
Keele Street, as a property of architectural and
historic value or interest under The Ontario Heritage
Act, 1974, S.O. Chapter 122.

Short Statement of the Reasons for the Proposed
Designation.

The part of Number 4700 Keele Street known as the
Jacob Stong House is recommended for designation
for architectural and historic reasons. It is a
handsome example of Ontario Georgian neo-classicism
with its typical three bay facade, two-and-a-half
storeys, gabled roof, rear additions and dichromatic
brickwork. The glazing pattern of the embrasured
transom and sidelights is especially notable. It
was built about 1855 by Jacob Stong, a prominent
member of the German community of Kaiserville.

Notice of objection to the designation may be served
on the City Clerk within thirty days of December 22nd,
1980.
