NOTICE OF INTENTION

Take notice that the Council of the Corporation of the City of North York on the 15th day of December, 1980, decided to designate the lands and building known municipally as the Abraham Hoover House, 4700 Keele Street, as a property of architectural value or interest under The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, S.O. Chapter 122.

Short Statement of the Reasons for the Proposed Designation.

The part of Number 4700 Keele Street known as the Abraham Hoover House is recommended for designation for architectural reasons as a rare example of board and batten construction in North York. Stylistically it combines neo-classical, Gothic Revival and eclectic Picturesque elements in the eaves trim, construction method and gabled massing. Built about 1848 by Christian and Abraham Hoover, it is a fine relic of the Pennsylvania German community in York County.

Notice of objection to the designation may be served on the City Clerk within thirty days of December 22nd, 1980.
