Take notice that the Council of the Corporation of
the City of North York on the 30th day of April,
1979, decided to designate the lands and building
known municipally as 355 Lesmill Road as a property
of architectural and historic value or interest under
The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, S.O. Chapter 122.

Short Statement of the Reasons for the Proposed
Designation.

The Clark Locke House, 355 Lesmill Road, is recommended
for designation for architectural and historic reasons.
It is a fine illustration of an architect-designed home
in the British country house tradition, a style that
found popularity in the area in the early years of this
century. The Toronto architect Hugh Allward was
inspired by the half-timbered buildings of 16th century
England, a picturesque style well suited to the
wilderness setting in which the Locke House is located.
The home was built for Ontario Premier George Henry's
daughter and her husband Clark Locke on a parcel of
land that was part of the Premier's Oriole Lodge Farm.

Notice of objection to the designation may be served
on the City Clerk within thirty days of December 22nd,
1980.
