RE: Designation of Old Court House and Jail Property
Town of Milton

Pursuant to Section 29, Sub-section 6 of The Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1980, please find enclosed a copy of By-law No. 16-82 designating the property as one of historical and architectural significance. No notices of objection were received to the proposed designation resulting in the By-law being given third and final reading on May 3rd, 1982.

It should now be noted that the Town of Milton has finalized the acquisition of the property from the Region of Halton and is now the official owner of the property. I would request that the Ontario Heritage Foundation now forward to this office the necessary Easement Agreements which the Foundation requires the Town of Milton to enter into. Your immediate attention to this matter would be most appreciated.

THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF MILTON

BY-LAW No. 16-82

A By-law to designate the property known Municipally as the Old Courthouse and Jail, 43 Brown Street, as being of architectural and historical value or interest.

- WHEREAS Section 29 of The Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1980, authorizes the Council of a Municipality to enact by-laws to designate real property, including all buildings and structures thereon, to be of architectural or historic value or interest;
- AND WHEREAS the Council of The Corporation Of The Town Of Milton has caused to be served on the Owners of the lands and premises known as the Old Courthouse and Jail at 43 Brown Street and upon The Ontario Heritage Foundation, notice of intention to so designate the aforesaid real property and has caused such notice of intention to be published in the same newspaper having general circulation in the Municipality once for each three consecutive weeks;
- AND WHEREAS the reasons for designation are set out in Schedule "B" attached hereto;
- AND WHEREAS no notice of objection to the proposed designation has been served on the Clerk of the Municipality;
- NOW THEREFORE the Council of The Corporation Of The Town Of Milton enacts as follows:
 - There is designated as being of architectural and historical value or interest the real property known as the Old Courthouse and Jail at 43 Brown Street, more particularly described in Schedule "A" attached hereto.
 - The Municipal Solicitor is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this By-law to be registered against the property described in Schedule "A" hereto in the proper land registry office.
 - 3. The Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this By-law to be served on the Owner of the aforesaid property and on The Ontario Heritage Foundation and to cause notice of the passing of this By-law to be published in the same newspaper having general circulation in the Municipality once for each of three consecutive weeks.

SCHEDULE "A" TO BY-LAW No. 16-82

Those lands and premises located in the Town of Milton, in the Regional : Municipality of Halton, and being composed of ALL AND SINGULAR THAT certain parcel or tract of lands and premises, situate, lying and being in the Town of Milton (formerly the Township of Trafalgar) and being composed of Part of Lot 13, Concession 2, N.S., more particularly described as being Part 1 on Reference Plan 20R-4492 dated October 18th, 1979 and registered in the Registry Office for the Registry Division of Halton (20).

SCHEDULE "B" TO BY-LAW No. 16-82

REASONS FOR THE DESIGNATION:

The former Halton County Courthouse and Jail property at 43 Brown Street is an example of elaborate Baronial Gothic Architecture. The castellated design is one of only three examples of this particular mode in the Province of Ontario.

Designed by the firm of Clark and Murray, and built between 1854 and 1855 by Michael Kenney, the building served as the first Seat of Government for the County of Halton.
