NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Milton intends to designate the property, including lands and buildings, at the following municipal address as a property of architectural and historical value under Part IV of The Ontario Heritage Act, 1980, R.S.O. Chapter 337.

Municipal Address: 43 Brown Street, Town of Milton (former Courthouse and Jail)

Reasons for the Proposed Designation: The former Halton County Courthouse and Jail property at 43 Brown Street is an example of elaborate Baronial Gothic Architecture. The castellated design is one of only three examples of this particular mode in the Province of Ontario.

Designed by the firm of Clark and Murray, and built between 1854 and 1855 by Michael Kenney, the building served as the first Seat of Government for the County of Halton.

Notice of Objection to the proposed designation, together with a statement of the reasons for the objection and all relevant facts may be served on the Clerk of the Town of Milton before the 23rd day of April, 1982.
