THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF MILTON

BY-LAW NO. 41-88

Being a By-law to designate the property known municipally as the stone barn at Lot 26, Concession 2, former Township of Nassagaweya, now in the Town of Milton, as being of architectural and historical value or interest.

W H E R E A S Section 29 of The Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O., 1980, authorizes the Council of a municipality to enact by-laws to designate real property including all buildings and structures thereon, to be of architectural and/or historical value or interest;

A N D W H E R E A S the Council of The Corporation of the Town of Milton has caused to be served on the Owners of the lands and premises known as Lot 26, Concession 2, former Township of Nassagaweya, now in the Town of Milton and upon The Ontario Heritage Foundation, Notice of Intention to so designate the aforesaid real property and has caused such Notice of Intention to be published in the same newspaper having general circulation in the municipality once for each of three (3) consecutive weeks;

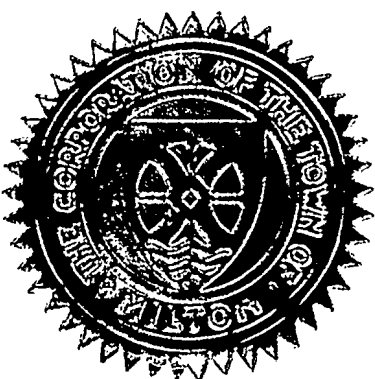
A N D W H E R E A S the reasons for designation are set out in Schedule 'B' attached hereto;


A N D W H E R E A S no Notice of Objection to the proposed designation has been served on the Clerk of the Municipality;

N O W T H E R E F O R E the Council of The Corporation of the Town of Milton enacts as follows:-


1. THAT there is designated as being of architectural and historical value or interest, the real property known as the stone barn, located at Lot 26, Concession 2, former Township of Nassagaweya, now in the Town of Milton, more particularly described in Schedule 'A' attached hereto.
2. AND THAT the Municipal Solicitor is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this By-law to be registered against the property described in Schedule 'A', attached hereto, in the proper Land Registry Office,
3. AND FURTHER THAT the Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this By-law to be served on the Owner of the aforesaid property and on the Ontario Heritage Foundation, and to cause notice of the passing of this By-law to be published in the same newspaper having general circulation in the municipality once for each of three (3) consecutive weeks.

SCHEDULE 'A' TO BY-LAW NO. 41-88

ALL AND SINGULAR that certain parcel or tract of land and premises situate, lying and being in the Town of Milton (formerly the Township OF Nassagaweya), the Regional Municipality of Halton, and being composed of the west half of Lot 26 in the Second Concession;

SAVE AND EXCEPT that part of the west half of Lot 26 in the Second Concession as shown as Part 1 on Reference Plan 20R-2638.

SCHEDULE 'B' TO BY-LAW NO. 41-88

REASON FOR DESIGNATION:

The stone barn, also known as an English Barn, was constructed in 1875. It is a unique style of barn with 22 inch thick walls, and is known to have existed in England well before the seventeenth century. It is one of the largest stone barns still standing in the Region of Halton.
