AND IN THE MATTER OF the building known municipally as Grant Trunk Railway Station, Part of Lot 1, Concession 3, in the Town of Milton, Regional Municipality of Halton, in the Province of Ontario.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

TAKE NOTICE THAT the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Milton intends to designate the building known municipally as Grand Trunk Railway Station, Part of Lot 1, Concession 3, in the Town of Milton, Regional Municipality of Halton, in the Province of Ontario, as being of historical and architectural value or interest under Part IV of The Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990, c.o. 18.

REASONS FOR THE PROPOSED DESIGNATION:

The Grand Trunk Railway Station, built in 1884, replaced the first area railway station, which was destroyed by fire. The station was originally located beside the rail line on Bronte Street. The station served passengers on the rail line at Bronte Street until the discontinuation of passenger service in 1960. The line ran north through Georgetown to Allandale or south to Burlington and Hamilton. In the early years, excursions were operated to Burlington Beach on holiday weekends.

The Grand Trunk Railway Station (presently the Chris Hadfield Park Facility), contributes to the distinctive identity of the Town. As the only remaining original Milton railway station, this building is considered to be a landmark of special value.

The exterior of this classic wooden railway station with its burgundy colour is complete with a central gable and two other gables, molded wooden trim and vertical plank board and batten.

NOTICE OF OBJECTION TO THE PROPOSED DESIGNATION, TOGETHER WITH A STATEMENT OF THE REASONS FOR THE OBJECTION AND ALL RELEVANT FACTS, MAY BE SERVED ON THE Clerk of the Town of Milton before the 16th day of June, 2002.
